<p>Note taking- Mindmap</p> <p>Watch News Round. Then create notes on the top stories using a mindmap. Be sure to include a title, headings and notes in clear sections.</p> 	<p>Nice or Nasty Game from NRICH</p> <p>Find a partner and a 1 – 6 dice, or even a 0 – 9 dice if you have one. You could use the dice in <u>Dice and Spinners</u>.</p> <p>Each of you draw a set of four boxes like this:</p> <p>Player 1: [][][][] Player 2: [][][][]</p> <p>Or you can download and print off this <u>scoring sheet</u>.</p> <p>Game 1</p> <p>Take turns to roll the dice and decide which of your four boxes to fill. Do this four times each until all your boxes are full. Read the four digits as a whole number.</p> <p>Whoever has the larger four-digit number wins.</p> <p>There are two possible scoring systems:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A point for a win. The first person to reach 10 wins the game Work out the difference between the two four-digit numbers after each round. The winner keeps this score.
